Who are these people?

Meldrum & Bourtie is set within a dynamic, rapidly expanding community in Aberdeenshire. Although rural in nature we are within easy travelling distance from Inverurie and Aberdeen. While wishing to take the best of our tradition with us, we seek to explore and embrace new and engaging methods of worship, teaching and outreach that speak to people of all ages.



Our Vision is to:

Meldrum Kirk:

In the small town of Oldmeldrum the present church has served the community well for over 300 years having moved from the 'Auld Kirk' at Bethelnie. <u>Meldrum</u> is a welcoming and inclusive church family who are open to new ideas.

Bourtie Kirk:

Nestling in the midst of Aberdeenshire fields at the hamlet of <u>Kirkton of Bourtie</u>, this historic little church sits on land that has been a site of Christian worship for over 800 years. Monthly worship here remains fairly traditional with services in an 'intimate' atmosphere.

We celebrate the beauty and heritage of our two church buildings but look to the future and what we can achieve together as one Church Family led by the Spirit.

In the spirit of inclusion the Kirk Session of Meldrum & Bourtie Parish has decided to depart from the procedures contained in the Ministers and Deacons in Civil Partnerships and Same Sex Marriages Act (Act I 2015) in order to permit the appointment of a minister who is in a civil partnership or a same sex marriage.

We like to think of ourselves as a friendly, good humoured congregation, many of whom work hard for God within and beyond the church. We gather for worship every Sunday in Meldrum and on the first Sunday of the month in Bourtie. We have a variety of different forms of worship. Sunday morning in church is a traditional service. The second Sunday of the month is usually "family worship" with less formality and more noise. After each morning service in Meldrum we share fellowship over a cup of tea or coffee. We also have:

- an active worship group who help prepare and deliver our family services
- formal Communion celebrated twice yearly with an informal Communion service on the last Sunday of the month after the morning service
- Sunday school which is held weekly in the hall
- monthly services held in our sheltered housing complex and nursing home
- shared ecumenical Easter services and an annual bereavement service, which is open to all
- Experience Easter & Christmas events which enables us to share our Christian beliefs and the stories with local primary school children, their teachers and helpers.

Our Minister:

We hope to find a minister who can inspire with clear preaching and thoughtful worship and leadership, who has a heart for building supportive enabling relationships of all ages.

We are restricted in what we do with Bourtie as this is an 'A listed' building but we ensure it is kept in order for its small but faithful congregation.



Though our buildings are well used and well loved, we recognise that they are going to need to be reconfigured to meet our needs and aspirations as a congregation. Our hall is situated some distance from our church which restricts the number of Sundays we have the children from the Sunday School with us in church. We are blessed to have a marketable glebe in the heart of the village and plans to sell it are well advanced. These funds should

allow us to: • fully renovate Meldrum Church



- install new eco friendly heating system
- renew electrics
- install modern IT equipment and wi-fi connection
- redecorate throughout
- build a new hall close to our church in Meldrum (we would aim to sell our existing hall)
- this will help provide modern facilities for the existing hall users.

We will be retaining 1.5 acres of land in the Glebe for future development. One option discussed is to develop a kitchen garden & café with training facilities for the community.
